

Naming Policy (February 28, 2014)

The following naming requirements apply for domain names in the .SAARLAND TLD:

Syntax Requirements for ASCII Domain Names:

- the domain name may only contain letters A-Z (case insensitive), the numbers 0-9, and hyphens
- the domain name cannot begin or end with a hyphen (“-”)
- the domain name cannot have two consecutive hyphens (“--”) in the 3rd and 4th positions, except when preceded by “xn” and followed by a string that corresponds with an IDN string
- underline characters are not allowed
- the domain name cannot exceed 63 characters (excluding the TLD)
- the domain name must have a minimum length of 1 character
- the domain name cannot consist of 2 characters according to ICANN Policy

Additional Syntax Requirements for IDN Domain Names:

- the domain name may only contain letters A-Z, ä, ö, ü (case insensitive), the numbers 0-9, and hyphens
- the “A-label” must be valid. This can be tested by decoding the A-label to a UTF-8 string, and then re-encoding. If the re-encoded string matches the original string, this test is passed.
- the A-label must be a valid domain name in its own right (i.e. length and composition rules for ASCII domain names must also be successfully passed).

Blocked Names are excluded from registration.

Reserved Names are only available if the special eligibility requirements are met.

Premium Names are only available at the discretion of the Registry.
